I enables speculators of every description to keep back their commodities restead of bringing them to market; it injures the public in the first meaning by occasioning the extra vagantities of prices, and ultimately it injures the speculators the macives, by inducing others to speculate in the same articles, on the strength of there artifie'el prices, till at length the quantity be comes too unwichtly to be neid, forced sa es are mode, prices fell to their proper

level, and the speculators are runned.
