spirit of this continuities, and sender were the crowns and kingdoms of his reighbours. He had no somer adopted this resolution, than he went to France to consult with the French ministry and government the means of effecting it.—
The French minis ers very naturally concurred in a measure, which by example the Sweden from all Russian interests and connections, rendered her a more equal opponent to that ambitious power, and thereby a more efficient

on his return fom Paris, the king, pfeviously arranged every thing, called a meeting of the diet, as if on some most important business. Upon the meeting, which from the expectation excited from the extraordinary summons, was very full, the chancellor, in order to take up a necessary, interval of time, entered into a long account of the state of the king-dom. The king himself enfered as he concluded, and briefly told the diet, that in such a state of the kingdom it was necessary to alea, or rather to do away entirely the existing constitution; that the po-pular liberties only fomented and che rished parties, which rendered the sovereign y a burthen to him; that he was resolved, therefore, not to be less a king than his neighbours, and had brought with him the scheme of the new constitution, and a deed of renunciation of all the popular rights, which he required them to sign before he left the hall of assembly; he added, that in order to prevent any riots, he had ordered the hall of the diet to be surrounded by cannon, with lighted matches, and none of the members of the diet would be allowed to leave the hall, or to pass the guard, till they had signed and sworn their acceptance and renunciation What were men to do in this situa-

It is unnecessary to add, that the king's wishes were accomplished, and liberties of a brave people thus forced from them at the mouth of the

To the long disgrace of the people of Sweden, the king was permitted to reign two or three years after this atrocious felony on the rights of the people. He at leng h, however, met his deserts, and died under the blow of one of his sub jects.

The late king of Sweden succeeded to the throne and new constitution procured by the fraud of his father, and therefore succeeded to the popular dislike, or at least indifference, which such conduct was calculated to perpetuate.-To this cause of indifference the late king scon added one of personal offence -He adopted the French war, and having once adopted it, persevered in it to the manifest ruln of his kingdom, and in decided opposition to the public voice-Had he remained king another year, Sweden would have been extinguished as one of the kingdoms of the north.

Hence the Indifference with which the Swedes beheld the deposition of this king, and hence the equal or greater indifference with which they have be held, in the election of Bernadot'e, the deposition of his whole family, and the entroduction of another.

Such have been the causes of this tranquil revolution.

As to the consequences, though they are certainly rather eventual than immediste, they are not of the less importance to a state which, as not being the crea-ture of a day, should extend its prulience with its natural duration, and provide for itself more remotely than is required of en individual.

These consequences are of two kinds; those which affect our commerce, and those which affect our national safety.

May not Sweden, in conjunction with Denmark, shut the Sound against the English trade? May she not, and will she not, prevent the supply of naval stores, of timber, &c. The most serious consideration, how

ver, is, that it throws into the hands of France, a nation of seamen, a people born to the occan, in almost an equal degree with Englishmen, themselves-Is it possible that with such resources France can long want a navy-Holland and Sweden, in this point of vic infinitely more consequence than all the Italian and Mediterranean conquests

The greatest difficulty of Bonaparte has been to man his navy .- There have been such vast calls on the population of France to supply the army, that the fleets of France, whenever they have been able to escape out of port, have always been found insufficiently monned.

population like that of Sweden, a Northern people, born on the shore of the sea, is therefore of infinite value to the naval views of Bonaparte-And what tre have just'y to dread from this kind of people, so employed, we may in som: degree be enabled to estimate, by recaling to memory, what infinite trouble the Dutch gave us in the commencement of the war, and what has always been the characteristic reputation of a northern people. The name of Van Trump is as little forgotten in England as in Holland.
