The French now have the whole of their force in the vicinity of Pinhel; including Reguler and Junot's divisions it is estimated at about 93,000 mon; the latter is with Massena. who can bring 60,000 troops into the field. Should he advance against lord Wellington, his lordship will, no doubt, retire to the Ponte de Marcella. We every hour expect to hear of this having taken place

"It is said that 8000 troops from France have entered Navarre. During the last four months Janot's division has experienced a loss of upwards of ten thousand men by desertion, sickness, and the sword. About 3500 troops have been sent from Salamanca to the Astu

"We have just learned that on the 6th our advanced posts were at Francos sa, and lord Wellington near Vizer."

On the 27th, two line of battle ships and a frigate that were blocked up in Cherburg, made their escape, when the Donnegal and Revenge were a few miles off that post.
