At a meeting of the counselles of the City of Rome, held in the city of Phfadelphia, the Sith of October. 1810, the following extract from the r. port of the commissions, was ordered to be published in two or more newspapers of the said cay.

" The commissioners report, trat agreeably The commissioners report, trat agreeably to the order of the counsellor, it y have proceeded to the city of Rome, when they arrived on the 21st day of cooker. 8 % and o that day fixed upon the set e and reaked the most eligible spot for a d datermined the course which the stree a set to run. They have measured the distance from the bridge across the Lebigh on the turn its leading to Wilkesbarre, and found the distance from said fridge. sured the distance from the bridge acrossine Lebigh on the turm it. leading to Wilkerbarre, as dround the distance from said bridge to the centre of said city of Rome, called Union Square, to be five ailes. Said bridge is about 160 m les from the city of Pailadelphia, and 17 miles and an half from Wilkesbarre, on the cast side of the Susquehanna. The centre of Union Square aforesaid, is situated a few feet above the adjoining aquarts. The quality of the land constained in the plan of the city of Rome, throughout the whole extent, appears to be a scellent, abounding with arreams of wholesome water, the principal of which is exiled to Tront Creek," which affords water safficient to turn mills of any description. The timber is valuable, consisting of sugar Maple, Black Cherry, Black Birch, White Ash, Spruce and Beech. The road (which is now pagared to be cut from the turnpike to Union Square,) is surveyed through a pleasant trict of country, and a surveyor is now engaged to lay out all the streets.
