The centre of Union Square afore aid, is situate on a gentle rise of ground, i redually elevated a few test above the adjeining square a The qually of the land contained in the plan of the city of itome, too ghout he whole extent app art to be accellent, abounding with streams of wholesome water, the printing of which is called "Trout reck," which affords water sufficient to turn mills of any description. The timber is valuable, consisting of augar Maple, Black Cherry, Black Birch, White Ash, Spruce and Beech. The road (which is now engaged to be cut from the turnpike to Union Square,) is surveyed through a pleasant tract of country, and a surveyor is now engaged to lay out all the streets.
