On application to Dorchester County Court by Samuel Smoot, of the county aforesaid, by petition in writing, praying for the benefit of the act of the General Assembly of Maryland for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session, eighth hundred and five, and the several supplementary acts thereto, on the terms mentioned in the said act, a schedule of his property and a list of his creditors, on oath, as far as he can ascertain them, as directed by the said act, being annexed to his petition; and the said court being satisfied by competent testimony that the said Samuel Smoot has resided in the two preceding years within the state of Maryland, it is thereupon adjudged and ordered by the said court, that the said Samuel Smoot, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in one of the newspapers in the city of Philadelphia, one in the City of Baltimore, and one in the town of Easton, 3 months before he Saturday next after the third Monday in March next, to be continued in said papers for six successive weeks, and also by setting up like notice at the Court-house door, three months before the said day, give notice to his creditors to appear before the said county court at the Court-house in the said county on the said day, for the purpose of recommending a trustee for their benefit, and to answer interrogatories which his creditors may propose to him; the said Samuel Smoot then and there complying with the requisites of
