They arriced themselves with hatchets and congregated at the depot for the purpose of breaking in, if necessary, and getting some flour stowed away by some speculator.

The agent refused them admittance, but finally agreed to let three of the women in, and said if any more got in they would have to walk over him. At this a large, stalwart woand they rolled out ten barrels of flower owned by a man in Charlotte, and had it hauled up. Subsequently they appropriated several bags of salt belonging to private parties. They also ulator in flour, and demanded to be let in; but the door was closed, and they went to work in satisfy them, told them he would give them ten barrels if they would leave and let him alone .-They finally agreed to it, and sent for a dray to hall it to the market house for the purpose of making an equal division of it.
