A Hebrew could not be a slave and therefore when by his own soluntary act, he obliged himself to serve "lorever," he was no more a slave than before, his master being obliged to treat him as a hired "servant."-He cannot be called a slave in this case, for slavery always implies involuntary cervitude, and the servitude of a Hebrew servant for life was always voluntary-of his own free will and accord. But even in the case when he voluntarily promised to "serve forever." the service was not necessarily to last during his whole life as I shall make appear very clearly. The text by which I prove that a Hebrew could not be a slave are as follows: Levincus ch. XXV.39, 40. "And if thy brother (neighbor or Hebrew) that dwelleth by thee be waren poor and" (therefore because of his poverty and inability to pay to you' what be owes you) "be sold unto thee; thou | -shalt not compel him to serve as a bound servant: 40. That the design of the law was in part to abolish slavery is proven by reference to Leviticus XXV, 8, 9, 10 verses. The 10th verse reads thus :- "And ye shall hallow the fifteenth year, (the year of jubilee) and proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof: it shall be a jubilee unto you; and ye shall return every man unto his possession and ye shall return every man unto his family.

Thus it appears that the ultimate design and effect of the law was to establish-not to extend or perpetuate-slavery, and thus it appears that Moses continued to be an abolitionist long after the Jews were released from their bondageeven unto the day of his death.
