TREASURY OF THE UNITED STATES WASHINGTON, Oct.14, 1864.

The first investment of the President was in 816,200 seven-thirty bonds, which were deposited in the vault of the Treatury as a special deposit, in the winter of 1502, and held as such until converted into the six per cent. bonds of 1861, in the latter part of July last.

The interest on the seven-thirty bonds was usually left uncollected long after due, and in one linstance, the interest was sent him in coin, which he returned with the message that he thought the Government needed the use of it more than

And on the 1st of August, 1863, a friend of the President came in the cash room with eleven Treasury drafts due the president, each draft beling for a month's salary, making in all preceding eleven months salary, or \$22,306 67, for which amount a loan certificate was given, payable in legal-tender Treasury notes, bearing five per cent. interest, payable in like funds; and seventeen days thereafter, another deposit of \$3.87473 was made for him, payable in like manner.
