Of course ther are to be commended for making this hoursbie reparation; but the marvel is none the less that tenders of conscience should be in an inverse ratio to the amount of which the Government has been defrauded. We should like to know, if that were possible, at what point the process of induration commences. Theologians teil us that the smallness of the sum taken does not after the nature of the sin, but they would, probably, be quite as much at a loss as we are to account for the fact that the heaviness of the sin appears to diminish to proportion to the extent of the peculation. That the same knave who feels very much ashamed of himself for defrauding the Government of five deliars might experience a secret satisfaction at defrauding it of half a million, is neither unnatural nor imprebable.
