

I left two rows of Corn near the middle of my field that I did not put the lerulizer on, and at this date it is most astonishing tisee the difference. The ground is of poo quality, yet the whole field looks splendid at this ime, except the two rows, and from presentapearance I need not expect much from them .-I also tried a few dozen rows on some rich bottronage extended to him and solicis a contibu- tom land, and the fertilized Corn is far ahead. In every variety-Tobacco very good and ex ance of the same at the sign of the RED FLAG. I have made up my mind to use it bereafter, on Dover street, where he promises to sell cheap. on rich and poor land, until something else is
