NEWS ITEMS.

According to the report just issued by the Bureau of Statistics, the number of passengers who arrived in the United States during the months of July, August and September, 1868, amounted to 94,957, divided into 57,348 males and 37,-609 lemales. Qi these, 82,895 were immigrants 9,302 citizens of the United States returning from foreign gravel, 2,700 foreigners not mending to remain. The 82,8.5 immigrants proper are divided into 49,478 males, and 33,417 feausles, and as to nationalities are distributed as follows : From Great Britian and Ireland, 29, 680; from Germany, Austra and Prussia, 38,-684; from France, Spain and Italy, 1,598; from other countries of Fatope, 5,512; from Asis, 4,291; from Atrica, 57; from other parts of North America, 2,577; from South America, 40; from West India Islands, 417; Irom countries unknown, 6. The 4,291 Asiatics were probably Chinese, of whom 3,593 landed at Ban Francis co, Colifornia, and 693 at Oregon City, Oregon. 
