seems in its symptoms those induced by the poison of strychnine. From all I've seen of the case, I have been struck by the inference that from exposure to the want of rest, and from sleeping on the damp ground, inflammation, or a high degree of irritation of the spinal cord was set up...

I have said that I have incurred such to have been the case, but it is by no means merely a matter of inference. Upon a minute examination of the young man, I am convinced that he is at this time suffering from a high degree of inflammation of the spinal cord, or perhaps, more properly speaking, of the investing membrane, and that unless he is relieved by proper treatment, a recurrence of all symptoms which ushered in the disease may be again expected.

I had not, I regret to say, an opportunity of a conference with Surgeon Smith after I had finished the investigation of the case, he having left for the city. I should have considered it my duty to have informed upon him had been in the camp, and I would have told him what my opinion was in the case.

St. Louis, May 14.—The first four regiments of volunteers of this State have been formed into the first brigade of Missouri volunteers.

About half-past five the prisoners of war left the grove and entered the road, the United States soldiers encircling them by a single file stretched across the front of the line.

The "Kentucky Regiment," called to sustain the Union, has been sent to the city of Cincinnati.

Individuals in Kentucky, on their own responsibility, had tendered to the General Government, nineteen out of every twenty were citizens of Cincinnati.
