The Journal of Commerce says: "There was a meeting this afternoon of the lead ng bankers and capitalists to agree upon some plan for combined action in reference to the Covernment loans. A majority were in favor of biding for the \$8,994,000 loan to be awarded on the list instant, a price about equal to the current market rate, and the probability is that the bids will average about midway, between 85 and 90." We hear that there is some apprehension for among capitalists that our Covernment, owing to the enormous increase of our national debt. will not be able for many years to come to meet its or ordinary expenses and pay the interest upon the debt without resorting to direct taxation. 'How

this will work causes much uneasiness among moneyed men. Whether our people will submit to "income taxes," and other measures resorted to in despotic governments remains to be seen. Letters from England received by the last steamer, from reliable sources, give more favorable accounts of the prospects of the British crops than i any beretofore received this year. The grain crops are unusually advanced owing to uncommonly fine weather, and very buoyant hopes are now
