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The Philadelphia Inquirer of this morning contains the following relative to the advance of Gen. Patterson towards Winchester.

As our advance guard was coming into Darksville, three miles back from this point, the Secessionists were just leaving, and the Twenty-first and Twenty-second regiments of the Pennsylvania Regiment followed by the Twenty-third.

Large numbers of New York and New England merchants are here to aid in having the duty reduced on iron and steel.

When about three miles from the camp, they came upon a man, who informed them that he had not far ahead were the pickets of the enemy.

General Butler was exceedingly sympathetic in his attentions to one London Times Russell, who had the honor of accompanying the Secretary of the North.

The peace-at-any-price folk went up from here to hold a mass meeting, for the evening, at a little place called Nye.

We have heard nothing of the privateer Jeff Davis, as yet, but from some of the vessels in search of her, we have heard that she is on the coast of the United States.

London, July 4.—The Prince of Wales has attended the Curragh Camp of Instruction, and is attached to the staff as a Colonel of the First Battalion of Grenadier Guards.

The poetess Elizabeth Barrett Browning died at Florence on Saturday last.

St. Louis, July 16.—The Washington correspondent of the Assayer, says that Capt. Sweeney's appointment as Brigadier General of the St. Louis Home Guard, was never confirmed by the government.
