SCENE AT A CAVALRY REVIEW.—Here is a
sketch of a thrilling scene which recently
occurred at an immense cavalry review in Vienna,
Austria.

manship displayed at a late review held at Vienna,
upon the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of the
establishment of the military order of the
Maria Theresa, when some thirty thousand cav-
alry were in line. A little child in the front row
of the spectators becoming frightened, rushed for-
ward just as a squadron of Hussars were charging
at full tilt—sweeping down with maddening re-
volity, may almost on the child.
