

BALTIMORE CLIPPER.

EXCHANGE AND MONEY MARKET, FOR JANUARY 4, 1841. Exchange has been very inactive during the last week. We quote Exchange on New York, 1 1/2 per cent. on Philadelphia, 1 1/4 per cent. on Richmond, Petersburg, Norfolk, and Winchester, 1 1/2 per cent. The failure of the Franklin Bank has thrown a gloom upon the Money Market, which will not be dispelled for some time.

THE DAY WILL BE LONG REMEMBERED BY THE CITIZENS OF BALTIMORE. In addition to the failure of the Franklin Bank, the Tide Water Canal Company will not pay more than about 20 per cent. on their loan of \$300,000, issued in Post Notes of the denomination of 50 and 100 dollars, which fall due to-day—they will renew the balance for the space of 6 and 12 months, issued in the same form.

ALTHOUGH IT IS THOUGHT BY A GREAT MANY, THAT A RESUMPTION OF THE BALTIMORE BANKS WILL NOT TAKE PLACE, we are convinced to the contrary, notwithstanding there are those who doubt the solvency of other institutions in this city. They will, however, be hard run for specie, and probably will have to redeem every dollar of their outstanding circulation.

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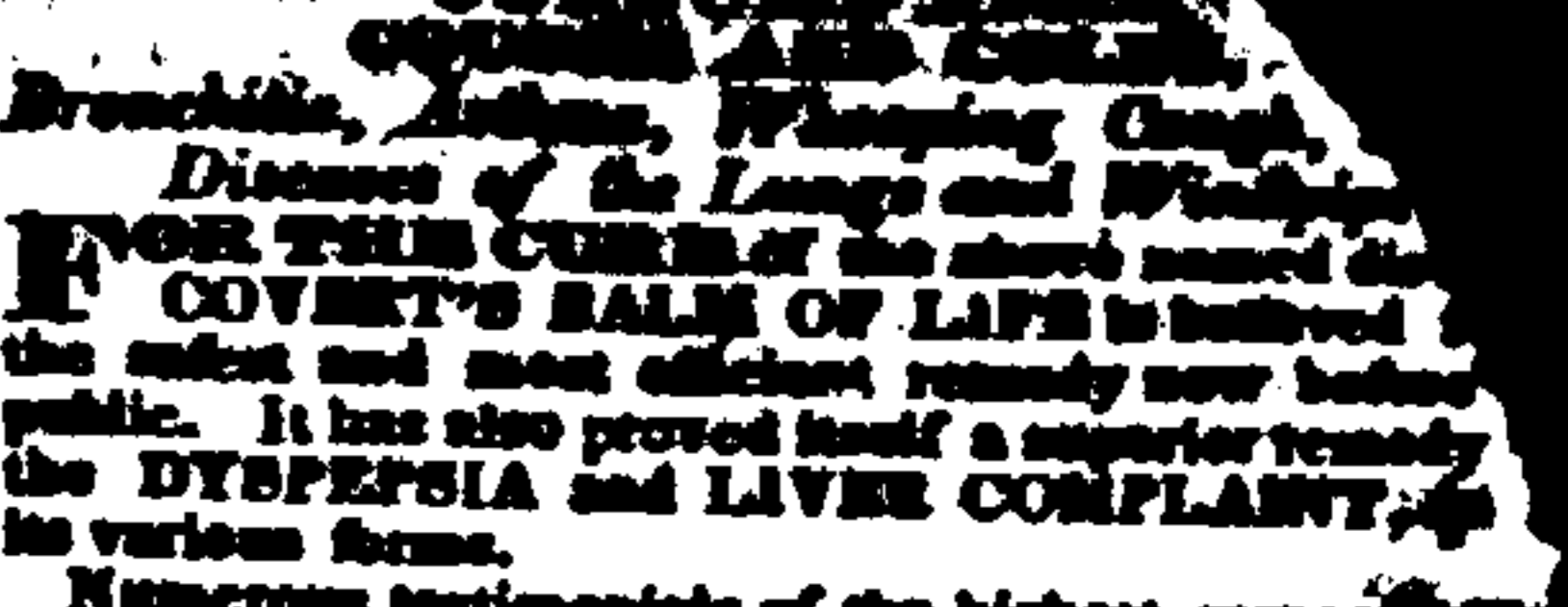
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
