the Society. Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the said corporation, and their successors, by the nam and title aforesaid, shall be capable, in law, to sue and be sard, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, defend and be defended, in all or any Courts of Justice, and before all and any Judges, Officers or persons whatso ever, in all and singular actions, matters or demands whatsoever.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the said corporation shall have power to hold stated meetings; to establish and put into execution, alter or abolish such by-laws, rules and regulations as to them thall seem most conducive to the interests of the Booiety; provided the same shall not be contrary to the laws of this State or of the United States.

Sec. 4. And be it exacted, That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to authorise the said corporation to leave any note, token, device or other evidence of debt to be used as a currency. Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That the right is hereby
