REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF WAYS AND MEANS.

Mr. Bender, from the joint committee of ways and means, submitted the following report, which was read and laid on the table.

The joint committee of ways and means ask permission to present their estimates for 1841: For the repairs of roads and bridges authorized by act of Dec. session, 1833, ch. 88, and Dec. session, 1836, ch. 120, to be levied on the value of lands and houses without the limits of direct taxation:

A tax of 2 cents on the \$100 upon an assessment as per report of the assessors of tax, upon \$3,265,160, will produce

School tax authorized by act of Dec. session, 1826, ch. 130—a tax of 11 cents on the \$100, upon assessed value of all the assessable property in the city of Baltimore, amounting to, say \$56,585,133, will produce

City court tax directed by act of Dec. session, 1837, ch. 122, to be levied on all the assessable property in the city:

By reference to the report of the register of the city, dated Jan. 19, 1841, it will be seen that the amt required to defray the expenses of the city court, will be \$17,951 33, a levy of 3 cents on the \$100, upon \$56,585,133, will produce
