1st. The repeal of the Sub-Treasury Law. 2d. The imposition of a tariff of duties sufficient to meet the expenses of the General Government.

3d. The adoption of a plan for the distribution of the proceeds of the Public Lands.

4th. The adoption of some plan or system for the safe keeping of the Public Moneys.

The latter, it is believed, has not been finally agreed upon, and it is not yet known whether a recommendation will be made for the establishment of a National Bank, or of some plan which will meet the approval of the people generally.

On the first of these subjects we shall say nothing. The expression of our sentiments might be deemed by politicians, a violation of our neutrality; so we let it pass. The second matter we hope will be strongly urged by the executive, and promply acted upon by congress. We have no idea that foreign agents and manufacturers shall be permitted to food our country with their goods, at a nominal duty, whilst the agriculturalists and others of the union may be subjected to direct taxes for the support of government.
