New Books. We have received from Messrs. Cushing & Son the following named works: "The Artist's Guide and Mechanic's Own Book." A very slight examination is sufficient to convince us of the practical utility of this volume, as it embraces information on chemistry, as applicable to the mechanic arts, electricity, galvanism, magnetism, pneumatics, optics, astronomy, and mechanical philosophy.

"The Life of Commodore Perry," by Alexander Slidell Mackenzie, U. S. N., 2 vols. The author states that this work was undertaken to sustain the reputation of Commodore Perry against an attempt made in the Naval History by J. F. Cooper, "to diminish that admiration with which the people of the United States have been accustomed to regard the memory of Perry."

"The Quadroons, or St. Michael's Day," by J. H. Ingraham, author of "Lafitte," "Captain Kyd," "Burton," &c. We believe that the author's former publications have been extensively read and approved; and, if "practice makes perfect," we presume that there must be an improvement in the present volume; but, as we have not had time to read them, we can give no opinion of their merits.

FOUND DROWNED. The Richmond Star says: "A boy named Smith was found drowned on Sunday, in the race of the Franklin Mill. Upon examination, it was found that his body was much bruised, and strong suspicions of foul play are entertained. It is said that the boy's father has been in the habit of beating him unmercifully, and considerable excitement is felt upon the subject; but, as the circumstances are about to be investigated, we shall wait for the result, before we give more particulars."

ATTEMPT TO BURN A SHIP. A letter from Capt.
