This morning, in the Court of Common Pleas, Judge King read a very long opinion on the executions taken by the Bank of the United States to the proceedings brought against it under the "Resumption Resolutions" of 1841. These exceptions, as has been previously stated, were that the resolutions were ex post facto, impaired the obligation of an existing contract, and were in collision with the constitutions of the State and Union.

In every aspect of the case he maintained that all the exceptions were well founded, and the only remedy that] was left the creditor was under the charter of the Bank, which subjects it to the penalty of twelve per cent. interest on every unsatisfied demand for specie, and a forseiture of charter is the refusal to pay continued over 90 days.

His associates also read opinions, much shorter, but arriving at the same conclusions. The motion to set aside the proceedings was unanimous. Judge King remarked in his opinion, that there were two other Banks in the State, that, like the Bank of the United States, were exempt from the provisious of the very salutary resolutions of the last session of the Legislature-thus establishing in favor of the Bank a most important advantage, in the present crippled state of all the Banks of the Commonwealth, and one which, while it supports and aids all the exceptions to the law, may in the same proportion oppress all the others.
