The following is the memorial: To the honorable the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore:

The petition of the undersigned, citizens of Baltimore, merchants, traders, and mechanics, humbly sheweth: That, in consequence of the enormous amount of money demanded for Gas by the Gas Light Company of Baltimore...

Your petitioners humbly ask the aid of your honorable bodies, and they will, as in duty bound, ever pray, &c. &c. Which memorial was referred to a joint committee, who brought in the following report: Mr. Cole, from the joint select committee to whom was referred the memorial on the subject of Gas, submitted the following report and resolution...

Whereas, Complaints have existed in this city for some time past, in regard to the high charges made by the Gas Company for the supply of gas; and whereas a petition from a large number of the citizens of this city has been presented to the City Councils, setting forth their grievances, and asking the interference of the Mayor and City Council, by appointing an Inspector of Gas; And whereas the Gas Company have by their memorial, denied the allegations contained in the petition referred to, and ask of this Council to appoint suitable persons to examine into the complaints of the petitioners; and particularly as to the quality of the gas furnished, and as to the correctness of the machine used for the measurement of gas, and such other matters as they may think useful to a full understanding of the subject.

Resolved, That a copy of the above-mentioned memorial and resolution, be signed by the Mayor and the Presidents of the two branches of the City Council of Baltimore, be forwarded to the Mayor and delegates from Baltimore to the Legislature of Maryland, with a request that they will endeavor to procure the passage of the act therein referred to.

Resolved, That the City Council do, and he is hereby requested to prepare a memorial asking that an act be passed, authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to appoint an Inspector and Treasurer of Gas, in the City of Baltimore.
