Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained, That from and after the passage of this ordinance, all Licenses now directed by ordinance to be granted annually, shall be made to terminate and expire on the first day of May next ensuing the date of said License.  
Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, That if any person or persons shall neglect to renew such License within twenty days after its expiration, he, she or they shall incur the penalty already provided for in the Ordinance to which this is a supplement.  
Sec. 3. And be it enacted and ordained, That it shall be the duty of the Register to notify all persons who are the possessors of Licenses, and of the provisions of this Ordinance, by advertising the same for ten days previous to the first day of May, in all the daily papers of the city.<
