BALTIMORE MARKET. April 23, 1841.

Flour. Sales of Howard-st. flour were made during this week at \$4.56. The store price to-day is \$4.52 a \$4.56, as to quality. We quote the receipt price from wagons at \$4.37 1/2.

Grain. Maryland white Wheat may be fairly quoted at 100/109 cents. Reds do. 95/99 cents. Sales of Susquehanna have been made at 93 a 96 cents. Maryland Rye we quote at 50 cents. Pennsylvania 54 cents. Corn, Maryland yellow 51/52 cents. White do. 43/49 cents. Maryland Oats 35 a 37 cents. Virginia do. 31/32 cts.

Cattle. Beef Cattle on the hoof we quote at \$7.75 a \$8.25 per 100 lbs. Live Hogs are plenty, and will bring from \$4.25 to \$4.50 per 100 lbs.

Provisions. In the provision market we note no material change. For the past week transactions have been tolerable. We quote mess beef at \$12.50, No. 1 at \$10.50 &c. according to quality. Baltimore Mess Pork continues at \$12.50; No. 1 \$10.50, and prime from 8 to \$8.50.

Whiskey. We quote hds. at 20c. and bbls. 22c. The wagon price exclusive of the bbls. is 18c.

But it still clings to the hope that the future has better fortune in store for the Mexicans—that after the Comanche Indians are extirpated, and the national coffers replenished, their banner will float proudly on the banks of the Sabine!

One of the Yucatan revenue schrs., the Ocean, was lately wrecked near Vera Cruz. Five of the bodies of the unfortunate crew were washed ashore off Goazacoalcos. The vessel is a total loss.

The Deceano, of Tampico, states that the Prefect of the department and the military commandant are about to have a road made between that city and the Bar. It is expected the commerce of Tampico will be greatly benefited by it.

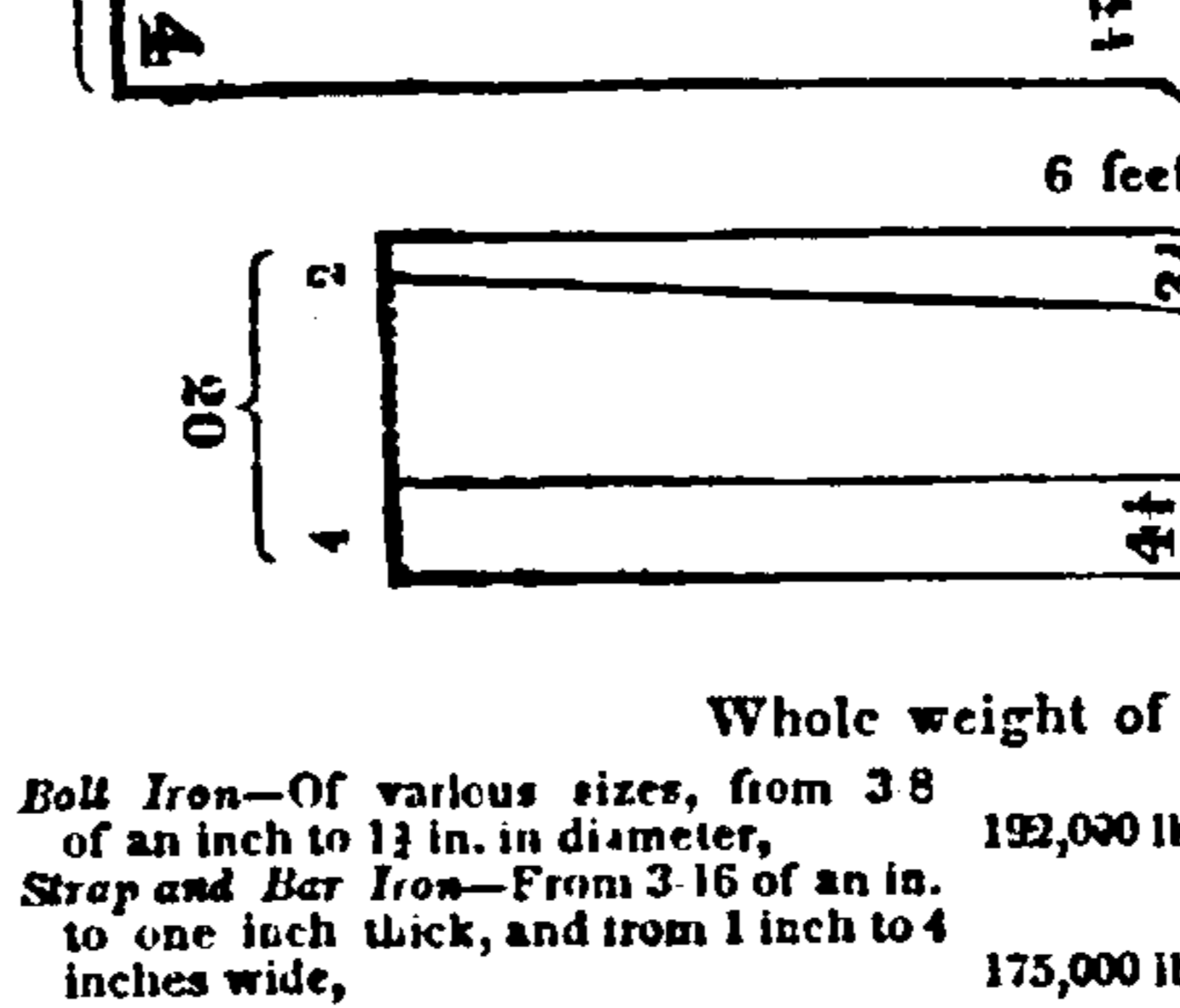

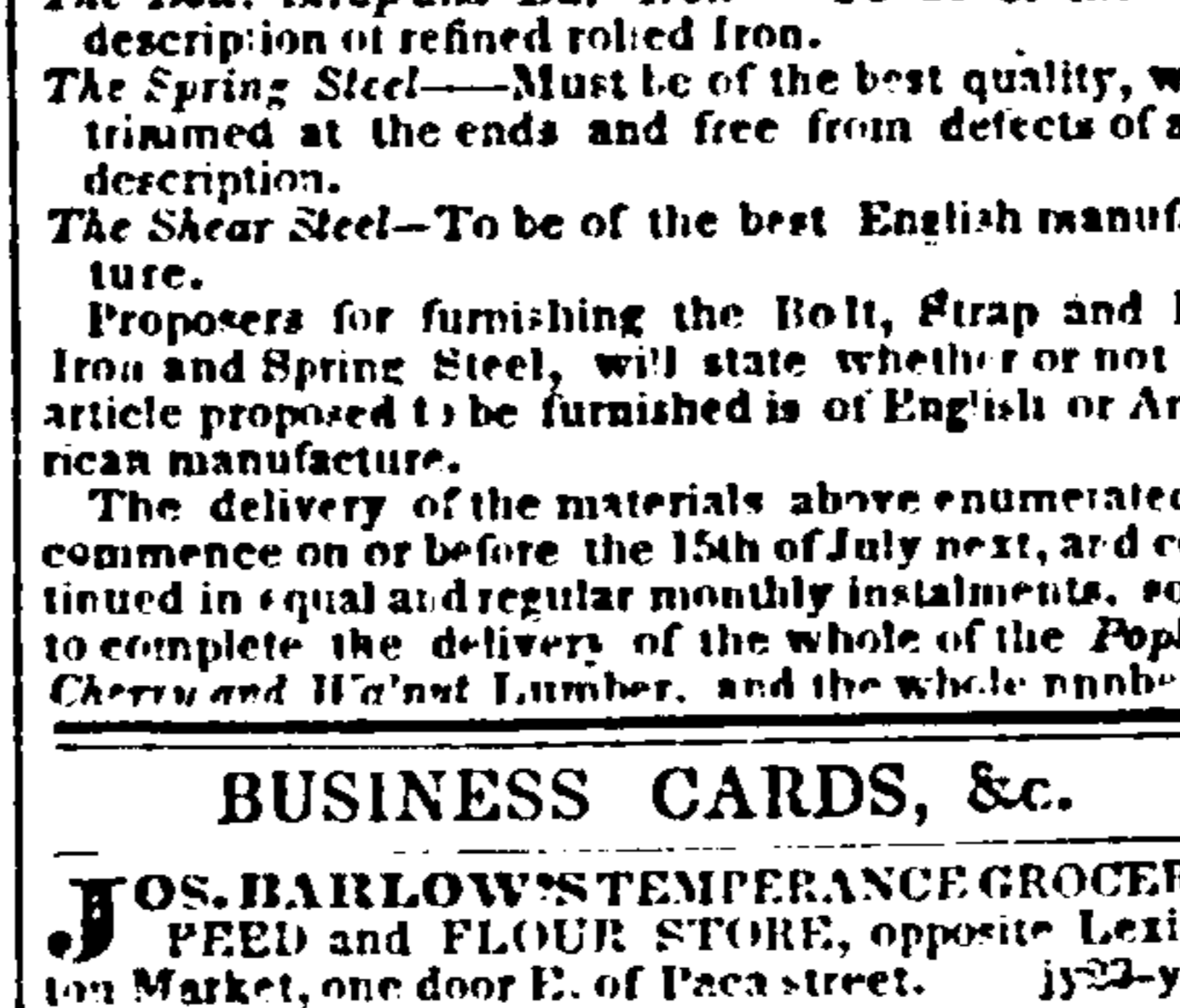
