### IN ADVANCE OF MAIL.

From the Boston Times Extra, Boston Mail, and Bay State Democrat. 11 DAYS LATER FROM ENGLAND. ARRIVAL OF THE CALEDONIA.

Non-arrival of the President—Meeting of Americans at Liverpool on account of the death of President Harrison—Parliamentary Proceedings—Disturbances in Ireland—France—Spain—Egypt—The East—Syria, &c.

The royal steamship Caledonia, Capt. McKellar, from Liverpool, whence she sailed on the 4th instant, arrived at her wharf, at East Boston, on the 19th inst. at 5 o'clock, A. M.

No intelligence of the steam ship President had been received in England, and all hope of her safety had been abandoned.

Rev. Dr. Reid has been appointed to the chair of Ecclesiastical History, in the University of Glasgow, vacant by the death of the Rev. Dr. McTear.

The St. Petersburg journals state that the quantity of gold obtained during the last year by private companies in Siberia, and the steppes of the Kizirs amounts to upwards of \$600,000.

General Sir Rufane Shawe Cookin, M. P. terminated his existence on the 1st May, at Southampton, by hanging himself.

THE CESSION OF HONG KONG. It is very generally reported and believed that Lord Palmerston is wholly dissatisfied with the preliminary articles, signed by Captain Elliott, for the settlement of the quarrel with China; and it is even added, that the Government is likely to increase the strength of the Chinese expedition.

THE STEAMSHIP PRESIDENT. The steamship President cost £50,000, and was insured on leaving Liverpool for \$60,000.

THE ST. GEORGE HOTEL. The loss is estimated at £10,000.

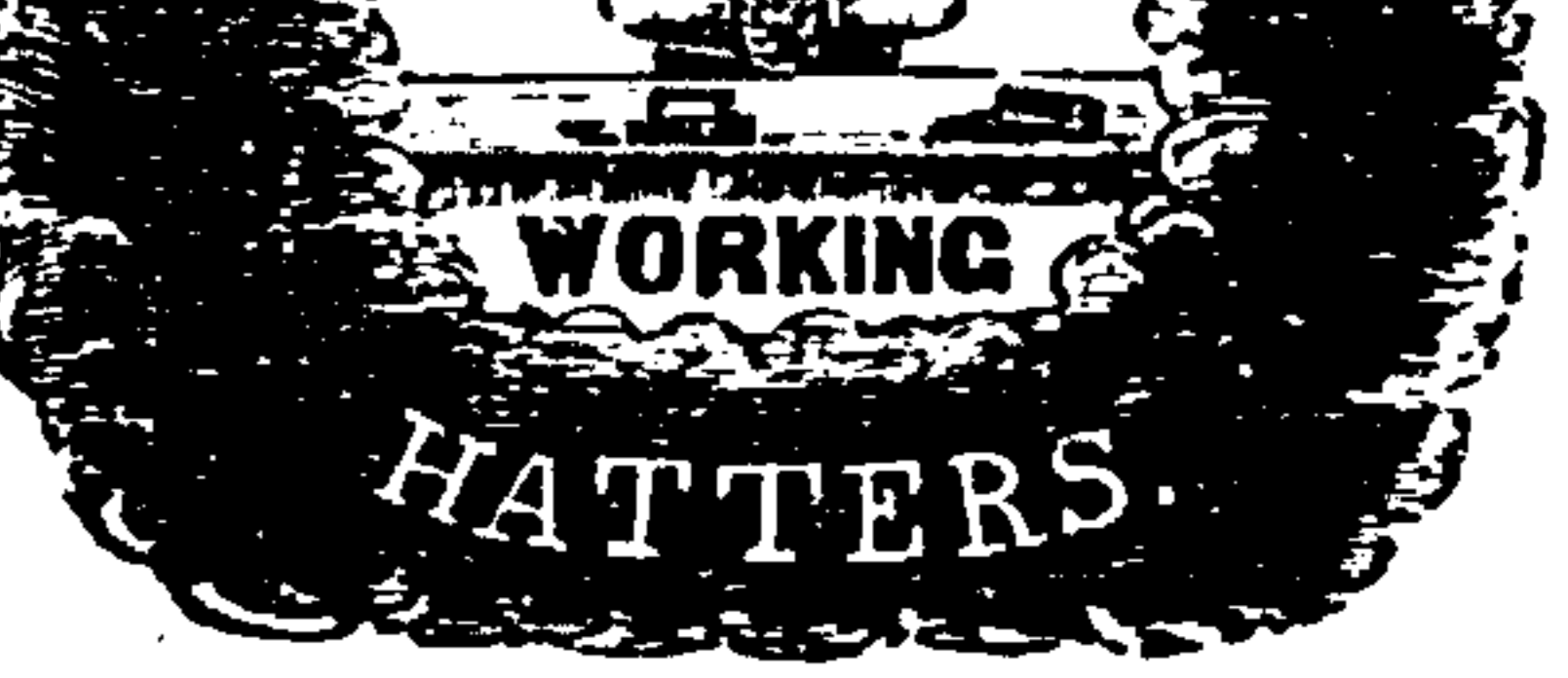
