### ARRIVAL OF THE ACADIA AT BOSTON. FIFTEEN DAYS LATER.

*Boston, June 2d, 4 o'clock, P. M.*  
The British Royal Mail Steamship Acadia, arrived at the Cunard wharf this morning, at 1 o'clock, and took us somewhat by surprise. She has proved herself worthy of her fame; having made the passage in thirteen days and a half. She left Liverpool on the 19th and had good weather most of the time; having seen only one iceberg.

The Great Western arrived at King's Road on the 14th, thus completing her home voyage in 15 days, and fairly beating the Columbia. The steamship Columbia arrived at Liverpool on the 15th, having made the passage in 15 days.

THE STEAMSHIP PRESIDENT HAD NOT ARRIVED, and no certain tidings had been obtained from her. Every breeze from the broad Atlantic, to the anxious watchers, gave signs of woe that all was lost. Every hope was abandoned to despair.

THE STEAMER PRESIDENT. The schooner Coreair, capt. Morisy, has arrived at Halifax, from Fortune Bay, N. F. in seven days. The Coreair reports that six days before sailing, a boat belonging to Fortune Bay arrived there from St. Pierre, the skipper of which reported that a vessel from France arrived at that island, which had picked up the captain and sixteen seamen of an American steamer, and had reported that fifty-six other persons, who had been in the steamer, were lost; the said vessel had foundered in consequence of running foul of an iceberg; the skipper stated that he had seen the captain of the steamer at St. Pierre.

LONDON, May 18.  
THE PRESIDENT STEAMSHIP. Up to yesterday (Sunday) afternoon, no tidings of the steamship President, Lieutenant Roberts, R.N. commander, had been received by the British and American Steam Navigation Company, at their office in Billiter-square, Billiter-st. The following reports have been received:  
"Cove of Cork, May 12.

"The Columbia Packet, Capt. Garrett, from Montevideo, which place she left on the 27th of Jan. for Antwerp, has come in here, and Capt. Garrett reports that 10 days since, 2d inst. in Lon. 18, he saw at some distance a large steamer, bound for the eastward, and which appeared to him to be disabled, as she was going very slowly and could hardly keep way with his vessel. As night came on he lost sight of her, and two days afterwards experienced a heavy gale to the eastward. The apparently disabled ship was so far from him that he cannot describe her appearance further than she was a large steamer."

Captain Garrett had not heard that the President was missing until asked by the gentleman (George Wright, Esq.) surveyor to Lloyd's who was good enough to favor us with these particulars.

An advance of from 1-2 to 2d per lb. has taken place in the London market.

GREAT BRITAIN. The business in the manufacturing towns still continues dull, and a great many workmen were out of employ.

The principal subject of excitement was the proposed repeal of the corn laws; but no definite action was had on the subject in Parliament.

Lord John Russell has announced his scale of corn duties to be substituted for the present protecting law. It is as follows:  
On wheat 5s. per quarter.  
On rye 5s.  
On barley 4s. 6d.  
On oats 3s. 4d.

FRANCE. The Court of Peers closed on Tuesday its secret deliberation on the affair relative to the attempt against the King's life on the 15th of October.

Two corporals belonging to the 25th Regiment, quartered at Eysee, near Agen, fought a duel a few days ago with swords. They wounded each other at the same moment so severely that one died on the spot, and the other's life is despaired of.

SPAIN. News from Madrid to the 8th had been received. The Chamber assembled on that day for the election of a Regent, and Espartaco was chosen on the first ballot.

Some serious disturbances had taken place in Zamora in consequence of the resistance of the population to the collection of the municipal taxes. Brigadier general Zubano, an ex-smuggler, and formerly a brigand of the Ebro, had marched from Valladolid to put down the insurrection.

On the 2d was celebrated the anniversary festival of the rising of the Spaniards against the French in 1803.

ALGIERS. The *Ibatanais* of the 9th instant, brings intelligence of fresh massacres committed by the Arabs in the environs of Algiers.

CHINA. An express in anticipation of the overland mail, arrived in London on the 6th ult. from which we learn that the China difficulty is still unsettled. Capt. Elliot is severely censured by the English opposition papers for his dilatory conduct.

The trade had not been re-opened on the 3d of February, as agreed upon, and every thing was still in uncertainty. Keshen and Capt. Elliot were humbugging one another; but it is said the Canton authorities were not pleased with the arrangement and there was a rumor of Kshen being about to be superseded.—Some think that a final settlement will not be obtained without further hostilities.

The smuggling of tea was active and easy, the article had dear. Two ships for London were nearly laden with them.

LOSS OF THE WILLIAM BROWN. DEARFUL SHIPPING. *Hare, May 10.*  
The Louis Philippe, New York packet ship, has this moment arrived. Information having reached the town that some shipwrecked seamen

were on board, the report became general that they belonged to the President, and the excitement was beyond all description. On the arrival in dock, however, a strong body of the gendarmes were in waiting, and immediately took into custody the mate and eight of the crew of the ship William Brown, bound from Liverpool to Philadelphia, which was sunk by an iceberg in the latter part of last month. It appears, when the vessel struck, thirty-three passengers, the mate, and eight of the crew took to the long boat; the captain, three of the crew and eleven passengers took to the jolly boat; all the rest perished in the vessel. The boats parted in the night. Some days after the mate and crew terminated, (as they say,) in order to lighten the boat to throw seventeen of the passengers overboard, which they accomplished, and some of the most horrid and revolting scenes took place.—Some clung to the sides of the boat, praying for mercy; but their hands were cut off, and they were pushed into the deep. Fifteen ladies and two men remained in the boat. One hour after this massacre the Crescent fell in with the boat, and saved the survivors of this horrid deed. The passengers remained on board the Crescent; the crew arrived in the Ville de Lyon; they are now under examination before the American consul. The result I will not fail to communicate to you; but you may rely on what I have already stated. The jolly boat has not been heard from. The dates of the Ville de Lyon have been anticipated by the Acadia.—*Morning Post.*

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS.  
EXTRAORDINARY FIELDS OF ICE. An extract of a letter written by Capt. Hoskins, commander of the Great Western, states that extraordinary fields of ice have been seen in various parts of the Atlantic. Some of them were a mile in length and 200 feet in height.

Mr. Power, it is said, had \$30,000 in specie on board the President when she left America, being the product of land which he had bought from time to time with his earnings in this country, and which he had sold previous to his departure, with the intention of consolidating his pecuniary means in the English funds.

A DEFAULTER. The Glasgow Herald quotes from the Edinburgh Post a report of the disappearance of a government official, a defaulter of £10,000. His income was £2000 a year.

THEFTS. Several servants in post offices in London have recently been committed for purloining letters containing money.

NARROW ESCAPE. On the 18th of April, as the Princess Wilhelmina of Prussia was playing with her governess at a window of the palace, she overbalanced herself and fell out, but was providentially caught by a journeyman shoemaker, who, observing her danger, ran rapidly and she fell into his arms.

DEATHS. Admiral Sir Lawrence Halsted, G. D. B., died on Thursday, 6th May, at Plymouth, at an advanced age, after a glorious career of upwards of sixty years in the service of his country.

The Right Rev. Robert Carr, Bishop of Worcester, died on Saturday, 8th May.

Thomas Barnes, Esq. for many years well known as the principal editor of the London Times, died during the second week in May.

LIVERPOOL COTTON MARKET, May 15. Today's demand for cotton has been very dull, only about 1,500 bags of all kinds having been sold. Prices are without alteration.

WHEAT MARKET, May 15. As it is quite impossible to give correctly the price of Cloth or Yarns, we can only say that, low as things were on Tuesday, the gloom then existing, if any thing, increased, as well as prices further receded. Goods are now so pressed on the market, that the decline is uncertain, though, since Tuesday's night, it may be stated at 1-2 to 5 per cent.

HAYE COTTON MARKET. By the French papers of the 14th and 15th inst. which came to hand this morning, we see that cotton at the Havre market on Thursday and Friday last, was again of heavy sale, though prices were pretty well maintained. The transactions during those two days were restricted to 183 bales Louisiana at 78 to 110; 77 Georgia at 97 to 106; 90 Mobile at 101, and 24 bales of Florida at 91 1/2.

FOREIGN MARKETS. The accounts from the South of Europe represent the Wheat trade as exceedingly dull at the principal ports in the Mediterranean. At Trieste, on the 21st ult., there was nothing what. At doing in Grain for export. At Dantrio, on the 1st inst., as improved liquidity had been experienced for Wheat at about former rates.

LONDON TRADE REPORT.  
MONDAY EVENING. In produce there was little passing to-day, buyers for the most part waiting for the large public sales declared for this week; prices, however, were firm for most articles. The arrivals were to a fair extent. The deliveries from the warehouses of goods, keep to a fair extent.

Texas. The demand was dull to day for free trade but prices were steady. Company's Cargoes were lower, 1s. 8 1/2 taken for cash.

Tallow. This market is dull. F. Y. Candle at 4s. 3d. on the spot.

### FALSE PRIDE.

*Messrs. Editors.*—Happening the other afternoon to stroll a short distance from the busy city, so peculiar to the country, I had indulged for some time in the contemplation of Nature in all her beauty, when my attention was called off from a subject so elevating to one of every-day life, by a conversation between two ladies, both of whom seemed too much interested to notice the proximity of a third person, and a stranger. The elderly lady was pursuing her companion for receiving attention from a gentleman who had the misfortune to have learned a trade, by which he was enabled to support himself genteelly without running in debt, and also to indulge himself in the innocent and social pleasures of polite society. The young lady defended with warmth the character of her friend, although she insisted his attentions were not particular.

This conversation, Messrs. Editors, which I had heard, or rather overheard, led me to reflect deeply upon the subject of PRIDE. I would ask you if in any part of the world a man ought not to be respected and entitled to the name of gentleman if his character and conduct is such as to merit that name, without any regard to the means he may choose to adopt for his support, or even to the possible obscurity of his birth? This, we know, is not the case in Europe; but in our Republic, are not the contrary sentiments at once unjust, disgraceful to our nature and a libel upon our government?

We admit the pleasure of following some of the liberal or learned professions, as also the superior one of tracing our descent from an illustrious source; but if a man is debarred these, is it not of itself sufficient, without making them a subject of reproach, and the mill-stone that is to drag him down, and forever prevent him from obtaining a standing in those circles which he is perhaps better fitted to adorn, than many whose hereditary standing is all that gains them admission?

In fine, is not the humble hod-carrier, who toils unceasingly at his laborious task, and limits his expenses to his daily wages, more truly honorable and deserving of respect, than the merchant who lives far beyond his income, and at last defrauds his creditors LEGALLY, by taking the benefit of the insolvent act? It may be said, that all persons engaged in business are liable to sudden and unexpected losses—losses impossible to foresee—such of course command our warmest sympathy—but when one who is only NOMINALLY a merchant or professional man, contracts debts which he knows his income does not justify, we contend that he is far beneath the lowest mechanic whom he may have defrauded, and for whom he affects so much sovereign contempt.
