National Union Nominations. FOR PRESIDENT: ABRAHAM LINCOLN, of Illinois. FOR VICE PRESIDENT: ANDREW JOHNSON, of Tennessee.

THE CANVASS OPENED—THE ELECTORAL TICKET AND THE MAYORALTY.

The meeting of the "Unconditional Union State Committee," as called, came off on Thursday in this city, under the auspices of Hon. Henry Hoffman; and so far as those present represent the Union men of the State, took action for a vigorous canvass, looking to the re-election of Mr. Lincoln.

And although the position—certain of them—we think, but "unconditional" at the time, so far as Mr. Lincoln was in the case, and although we are constrained to regard their position before the people as candidates for public favor, now, as any thing else, more than legitimate, the nomination being based on assumptions and contrary to precedent—we have no wish, looking to the future, to disturb the electoral ticket as now in the field, but would, instead, counsel all to let it stand; and more, support it with due earnestness, since those upon it have, in effect, repudiated and condemned the views of Mr. Davis as set forth in the notorious "Wade and Davis manifesto," inasmuch as in the face of that document they heartily endorse Mr. Lincoln.

How much by way of setting matters right, in his case, so far as the support of other Union men, the old friends of Mr. Lincoln, bears more than they were entitled to, according to usage and precedent. Now for the pitch of the official proceedings as reported:

The following resolution, as presented by Mr. Whitebeck, of Baltimore county, was approved by a unanimous vote: Resolved, That it is advisable to enter at once upon a vigorous canvass of the State, so as to secure the adoption of the new Constitution, the election of the Unconditional Union candidates for State officers and for Congress, and the support of Lincoln and Johnson.

That at least one mass meeting be held in each county, together with such district meetings as the Executive Committee of each county may appropriate, and that the Executive Committee secure speakers for the county meetings, and furnish such documents for the general distribution as either the National or State Committees may publish during the campaign.

The following resolution was offered and unanimously adopted: Resolved, That this Committee, representing the Unconditional Union party of the State of Maryland, hereby reiterate their unimpaired confidence in the ability and integrity of Abraham Lincoln, and their determination by all honorable means to secure for him the electoral votes of the State.

It may be thought that the foregoing comprises all that is really needful in the way of cutting loose from Mr. Davis; and perhaps it is. There are those here, however, who have made an unmitigated record in regard to this matter, and who, like the immediate constituents of Mr. Wade, in Ohio, were not content to deal in generalities or inferences in a matter of such grave import. The times demand the most unmitigated condemnation of all disorganizers; of all in any wise allied with copperheads or any of the factions hostile to the Union nominee for the Presidency; and we are glad to know that the great mass of the people of Maryland, the truly loyal, had no difficulty on this head.

So much for the "Unconditional Union State Central Committee," and the Electoral Ticket put forward under their auspices. But there is another matter.

Certain persons of the same wing of the Union party here, deemed it needful not merely to raise the difficulties in regard to national politics, but they ventured to do a little bit of "unparliamentary" to use a favorite term of their accredited leader—in relation to city officers. They deemed it essential to their purposes to have a candidate in the field for Mayor, put forward on the most meagre assumptions. Now, although, for the sake of needed harmony in relation to national politics, the Union men are willing to overlook the irregular and unwarrantable action of their co-partners in the Union ranks, yet in the case of city affairs, of the Mayoralty, they do not intend to stand it at all. To concede this would be altogether too much to expect; and so it is that on this score they will be inexorable. Nobody, we believe, questions the talents, and patriotism, and cleverness of Mr. Stirling; but if he chooses to show himself to be pious in a wrong position; if he is willing to make the instrument to irritate and divide the Union party, unwarrantably, he must not be surprised if those who concede much in regard to national politics for the sake of needed harmony, will concede nothing here. Those who took the initiative in fixing upon the Electoral Ticket had some slight pretext for doing it; they were not without some appearance of right; but in the case of the Mayoralty, no more meagre or baseless pretensions can be concocted that the action which put Mr. Stirling in the field.

Electoral Ticket—we repeat—stand. No one need fall out with the clever gentlemen upon it; but give us, when we concede this, the election of Hon. John Lee Chapman, and record of a public officer, none can impeach. Staunch and true to the Union, and eminently successful in his administration of the city government in perilous times, Mr. Chapman deserves the support of every loyalist; and for Mr. Stirling, deserving also—in his way, he can await a nomination to be in the future more fairly made.

McClellan and Pendleton. The public Democracy have been in a good many places in the past, in the need they were under to keep up the appearance of consistency, but in the Chicago nomination they have utterly thrown overboard every semblance of what is truthful and honest. Only for Horatio Seymour's kid-gloved fidelity, they might have had in him, one, who as an exponent of the "peace" doctrine proper, could have given the Union party some trouble—perhaps. But with McClellan, who has made all the little he has characterized by the ear, and whose record—so far as it goes—was well said by Harris of this State to be as offensive to the Copperhead rank and file as even Butler's, how does it stultify and put to utter shame all their past professions? Not a measure complained of as a specialty with this administration but McClellan is involved in it; the approval of "arbitrary arrests," the draft, and the war measures, all being endorsed by him.

And as white is to black, or the reverse, so is Pendleton of Ohio, his friend never having approved of a single war measure since he held a seat in Congress, having himself acted in concert with Vallandigham, as an out and out "Peace man," and as even Butler's, how does it stultify and put to utter shame all their past professions? Not a measure complained of as a specialty with this administration but McClellan is involved in it; the approval of "arbitrary arrests," the draft, and the war measures, all being endorsed by him.

Well, the people might have been cheated to some extent, by some combinations that could have been made—they will not be deceived by this. The case is too plain.

STRONG SPEECH OF GOV. MORTON. At Indianapolis, on the 29th ultimo, there was a grand reception of several retiring regiments. Governor Morton made a stirring address to the soldiers, in the course of which he discussed the question of an armistice as follows:

"It requires two parties to make an armistice, and if the South has already declared that it demands a withdrawal of our armies from the South as a necessary preliminary to any negotiation, who shall ask for an armistice? Shall our Government ask for terms at the hands of the South? Will this audience of soldiers agree to that? (Cries of "No!" "No!") But what does an armistice mean? It means to cease operations in front of a battle line, and to leave the hold on the enemy; it means to stop Farragut at Mobile. As every one knows, diplomacy takes a great deal of time, and probably at least as much as we are expending at the present time. Our war operations to be hindered away in armistices, and then find ourselves carried into the winter, when our campaign must necessarily close. Can we voluntarily come back into the Union and give up those very ideas for which they have suffered a long and bloody war? Especially as to acknowledge, by taking an armistice, that we are unable to conquer them?"

"Can we coax them back? If we try that, we shall have to agree to pay their debts, to give them back their widows and orphans and maimed soldiers; we shall have to pay the damage that has been done to the Southern States during the war, and more than all, we shall have to acknowledge the doctrine of secession. Suppose we succeed. When we come to voting money to pay the war debt of the South, or to pension their soldiers, or to reimburse them for damages, abolitionists, Massachusetts, abolition Ohio, abolition Wisconsin will tell us, 'We do not want an armistice; we wanted to fight them out; you have acknowledged secession; you have admitted that we will quietly walk out. In this way the Union would go to pieces, and the country was tried to save broken up by the very compromise that was intended to save it. We can make no compromise but what will break up the Government.' The only way to get out of the war is to fight it out. (Applause.)

"What peace men say the North is exhausted. The cost of this war is not one-half of the profits of the country. We have never been as wealthy as now, and there are three millions of men in the North who have not yet been able to make a mark in this war. As we exhausted General Grant has the Rebellion by the throat in front of Richmond, and the General has told a United States Senator that he would march his army to New York, Philadelphia, and Washington should be burned. Sherman is all right at Atlanta, and we will crush this Rebellion if we are not pulled off by the traitors at the North."

WHAT WE MAY EXPECT.—The Chicago platform means aid and comfort to the rebellion, and aid and comfort to every Union soldier, to every loyal man, and its success will bring about one of three things, viz: 1st, An armistice, which will give the now almost exterminated rebellion a new lease of life; or, 2d, a peace, which will give the rebellion a new lease of life; or, 3d, a cowardly trucking to the rebellion, which shall trail our old flag in the dust at the feet of traitors, and welcome, cap in hand, the chief rebels to the highest seats in our national synagogues. Either of these three results is too terrible to think upon; each of them, in the guise of peace, is only the prelude to a fiercer state of civil war.
