THE HOPEFUL ASPECT OF AFFAIRS The conviction is upon the country—upon the loyal and traitors alike, that the rebellion has nearly reached the final crisis, a view of the case as plainly to be deduced from the confessions of the rebel prints themselves, as from the telling victories of late, which have favored the Union arms. Journal of Commerce. It says: "There is a very evident disposition among "some of our leading merchants to rid them-"selves at an early day of the responsibilities "of business. In most cases, the parties, from "the nature of their business, are large hold-"ere of merchandise, and the motive assigned "for their retiring is an apprehension that the "return of peace will produce a heavy decline "In prices, involving holders of heavy stocks "of goods in ruinous losses, and producing "failures in business engagementr."

And there can be little doubt but that as a general thing, the mercantile community are keen-sighted to a marvel in detecting the tendencies of those political events which bear directly upon their own business operations, and accordingly all should hail the sign given above of a return to peace and its consequences, with much of confidence, and much also of thorough satisfaction.

But we would add to the above something more that comes to us with the force of conviction. When peace does come—as come it must,—the South will be in need of every aurplus article which may clog the markets of the North. Not an article of prime necessity, at least, that can be named, but will be in instant demand, and that there is gold in that section to pay for these things none need doubt.
