To be delivered, with forty-five (45) days after opening the bid, at the wharves in Washington or Georgetown, D. C.

The Wood to be good, merchantable, sound Pine Wood, suitable for use as fuel, and must be submitted by an Officer or Agent of this Department, as to its measurement and quality, before it is received.

Bidders must be prompt to respond to their bids, and to declare their loyalty, and their ability to comply with their bid, should it be accepted.

Payment will be made in certificates of indebtedness on the part of the Government.

The Government reserves the right to reject any bid for any cause.

### PROPOSALS FOR FURNISHING THE PAPER FOR THE PUBLIC PRINTING.

#### OFFICE SUPERINTENDENT PUBLIC PRINTING.

In pursuance of the resolution of the seventh section of the "Joint Resolution in relation to the Public Printing," approved June 22, 1860, sealed proposals will be received at this office until 12 o'clock, M., for furnishing the PAPERS that may be required for the public printing for the year ending on the 1st day of December, 1861.

The proposed documents, as nearly as can be ascertained, of what kind of paper that will be required.

CLASS 1—UNCALENDARED PAINTING PAPER.

15,000 reams fine printing paper, uncalendared, to measure 34 by 24 inches, to be delivered to weigh fifty pounds to the reman of 500 reams.

CLASS 2—CALENDAR PAINTING PAPER.

6,000 reams fine printing paper, calendered, to measure 24 by 34 inches, and to weigh fifty-six pounds to the reman of 500 reams.

CLASS 3—CALENDAR PRINTING PAPER.

500 reams superfine printing paper, hard s'zed and supercalendared, to measure 34 by 24 inches, and to weigh fifty pounds to the reman of 26 sheets.

CLASS 4—MAP PAPER.

2,000 reams superfine map paper, sized and calendered, of such sizes as may be required, corresponding in weight with paper measuring 34 by 24 inches, to weigh twenty-two pounds per reman of 400 sheets.

CLASS 5—PLATE PAPER.

500 reams superfine plate paper, 19 by 24 inches, and of such weight per reman as may be required.

2,000 reams map paper, 19 by 10 inches.

2,000 reams flat cap, 12 by 16 inches.

1,000 reams table cap, 16 by 24 inches.

1,000 reams table cap, 12 by 24 inches.

1,000 reams double fold, 22 by 34 inches.
