The Ninth Maryland in Georgia.—We have received a list of names of prisoners of the Ninth Maryland in Georgia, who were taken on the 21st of May from the city of Savannah, with the names also of those amongst them who have died. The rebel prison at that point contains some 10,000 men, now being held under the new arrangements just entered upon for that purpose.
