The Baltimore and Ohio Railroad.—The thirty-sixth annual report of the President and Directors of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, read to the stockholders, and after the meeting had adjourned, the following Directors were elected for the ensuing year.

It is shown that the earnings, in comparison with preceding years, have increased \$1,370,433.74, and the working expenses \$36,110.92, making a comparative increase of net profits of \$1,334,322.82.
