Burgesson's report: "As there are many inmates of the prison too sick and feeble to get through the crowd and report at sick-calls, and as many die from want of attention, I recommend that it be made the duty of each medical officer to visit the sick, and make the necessary prescriptions for such members of his detachment."

Burgesson's report: "I would suggest a new arrangement during sick call. At present it is impossible for all the sick to get out; the little gate through which they enter is not sufficient to admit all. I think it would be better to open one half of the large gate, which would give ample room."

Burgesson's report: "I would recommend that barracks be furnished the sick, so that they may be raised from the bare ground. If they cannot be furnished, that sufficient number of passes be granted to the sick, so that they may go out and gather herbs and straw for the men to lie on and thereby alleviate their suffering."

Burgesson's report: "I found the barracks in a very dirty and disagreeable condition, in consequence of a very bad supply of very poor water for the patients. I would again respectfully call your attention to the diet of the sick and the great improvement which might be made by mixing that flour with a portion of the meal (well sifted) now made for the unpalatable, indigestible, disease-producing bakery bread."

Burgesson's report: "In examining the kitchen or cooking department, I find the beef in very bad condition, having been blown by flies so long, that it was infested with live insects or creepers."

Eight of the crew of an English vessel which arrived at New Haven a few days ago, were detained in the harbor because they were not allowed to go on shore. After a struggle they were placed in irons.
