LEGAL NOTICES.

OFFICE OF THE APPEAL TAX
COURT, BALTIMORE, NOV. 21, 1861.

NOTE TO BUILDERS AND OTHERS.

You are directed to call to the following ordinances, the provisions of which will be strictly enforced, if not complied with.

A bill, entitled an ordinance to regulate the erection of buildings in the City of Baltimore.

Section 1. It is enacted and ordained, by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That from and after the passing of this ordinance, it shall be illegal for any person, without a permit from the Appeal Tax Court, to put up or maintain any building upon any new foundation, whether in connection with an existing building, or to put down any old building or part thereof, or to make any addition thereto, or to put up an additional story upon any building or part of a building, by increasing the height of the walls, &c.

Section 2. It is enacted and ordained, That it shall be the duty of the Judges of the Appeal Tax Court to grant such permission as may be required, to any person who has obtained a permit, to pay a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each day that he continues to violate this ordinance.

Section 3. And be it enacted and ordained, That any person who shall offend against the provisions of the first section of this ordinance, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each day that he continues to violate this ordinance.

Section 4. And be it enacted and ordained, That it shall be the duty of the Judges of the Appeal Tax Court to grant such permission as may be required, to any person who has obtained a permit, to pay a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each day that he continues to violate this ordinance.

Section 5. And be it enacted and ordained, That it shall be the duty of the Judges of the Appeal Tax Court to grant such permission as may be required, to any person who has obtained a permit, to pay a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each day that he continues to violate this ordinance.
