SPECH BY THE VICE-PRESIDENT ELECT.

THE RECONSTRUCTION QUESTION.

The following speech was delivered by Hon. Andrew Johnson before the Constitutional Convention of Tennessee:

"Gentlemen.—By your invitation I come up with you to speak. To be serious is not intended to address you in the capacity of a Conventioneer. You are here in the capacity of a primary convention, and as such I address you."

You have all gazed upon me every hour or in the gift of the people of our State.

You are here in a primary meeting de-

liberating a lot is here to relieve our country.

Parties have last evening day.

Our cause is now decided and we are laboring for a common cause, and lay aside their bits.

A Democratic form of government, or a Republican form of government, is the strongest form in the world.

By the Constitution of the United States you are free for periodical changes; you have a revolution every four years.

How has the Executive of the United States conducted this war? He has not conducted it well.

The most popular heart of the country is the Democratic party.

It is not the Van Dusen kind of Democ-

racy, or the McClellan kind, but the peo-

ple's democratic heart of the people has decreed that this rebellion should go down.

When the people try to restore a Gov-

ernment, it is the duty of which

may be called upon to do unconstitutional acts to restore the nation and save the country.

There is a material difference between

disorder and invention, by inventing

Colombus we would have discovered

this continent; though sometimes an in-

vention discovers a principle. In our Gov-

ernment there are great principles, and

the foundation of which, it under-

stands, will prevent it from being any more libe-

ral.

Monopolies are contrary to the genius

of a free State.

We have had one of the greatest

monopolies in the Southern States.
