THE LOFTIEST AND WILDEST RE GIOR OF THE SIERRA MEVADA. The following is an interesting narrative of recent operations of the State Goo-Infical Survey, furnished by Professor

The party left Visalia early in June and worked east to the creat of the Bierra. along the divide between the King's and Kaweah rivers. After passing the lower foot-hills and attaining an altitude 1,000 feet, the region becomes beavily timbered with pines and firs.
