## THE PATRIOT WHICH IS INSETTING DOWN ON THE ENGINEERS OF THIS REBELLION.

Since the rebellion led off in such a whirl of excitement and temporary success, there has been no time when events in the South commanded themselves as much to the thoughtful consideration of the sanguine engineers of it, as just now. Happen what might of disaster to their cause, such as the taking of Nashville and New Orleans, and scores of other places, calculated one might suppose to cause them serious misgivings as to a final triumph of their purposes, it was always in their power, somehow, to put by the disaster, to excite it, to make it appear, after all, as possibly a benefit. Ingenious and determined in misleading their ignorant and fiercely prejudiced subordinates, they have been enabled to keep them up to this time—throwing away life and property upon an idle quest; but the hour is come at last when in the face of the advance of the Union armies, resolute, sweeping, while States are traversed, no excuse will answer; nothing can hide from the thousands of the rank and file of the rebel armies, that they were getting thoroughly whipped.

And the evidence of this comes up to us now in numbers and varied forms. The streams of deserters that pour into our lines, all tell the same story, and the rebel prints—out of breath with lying up to this time—make a virtue of necessity, and admit the facts. And it has come to that with them, too, that they seem content to chronicle one disaster after another to their forces, in a sort of stoic, dumb-founded amazement. They have ceased to rave about it; to blame this or that high civil or military functionary for what is occurring, because they know at last, that no talent, nor resolution will avail, when military resources are exhausted—and that the game of battle is length played against such odds as to preclude all hope of success on their part.

We have been forcibly struck with all this, on the return of rebel accounts of Sherman's recent movements. After stating that the national troops have gained a great comfort in the "very extensive piece of woodland" recently taken into our lines at Hatchet's Run, the account proceeds with a cecile of detail, as follows:
