THE RE-OPENING OF TRADE WITH THE SOUTH.

With the war brought to an end in Virginia and the States directly south of us, however such a conclusion may for a brief space be postponed in the extreme Southwest, we can see no good reason why the government should not throw open such States to the free trade, because soon nothing can be sent either will have any chance of being used further in the interests of the rebellion. And could the Government adopt this policy promptly, it would go far to abate those apprehensions now indulged somewhat, that with the ending of the conflict must come stagnation in trade and financial embarrassments.

Let it be noted that whilst the North has abundance of manufactured goods, of provisions, and all else such as the South most needs, the latter has large quantities of tobacco, cotton, and even of Federal currency which has found its way thither by a thousand channels since the war began. Indeed, it would not be very surprising, if the South was measurably well supplied with means to purchase—considering the enhanced price of her staples—and as the two sections were never in a condition to exchange with each other to more manifest advantage, it appears to me that not a moment should be lost in conferring upon one citizens the privilege of re-establishing the old trade relations with certain points like Richmond, Wilmington, Charleston and Savannah.

And because matters of this kind have not as yet attained any definite shape, how suddenly has the commercial world called a sort of halt, to see what next is to be done! Even gold stands still, or nearly so, whilst the fear that trade may again quench the money market "night," causing men to hold with a former grasp to any string of land, for fear that they may be caught in a close place.

Now that there is the slightest cause for anything approaching anxiety, seems absurd. Not for years have our balances with Europe been so well adjusted, made safe for us.
