THE SURRENDER OF GEN. LEE-POPULAR REJOICINGS.

CINCINNATI, April 10.-The news of the surrender of Gen. Lee's army was received here about 10 o'clock last night The news spread rapidly throughout the c'ty, and immense crowds filled the streets. Boutires were lit on every corner, and blazing rockets filled the air, whilst cannon were fired from various points. The demonstration was continued all night.

REPORTED EVACUATION OF RA-LKIGH-OPERATIONS OF STONE-MAN'S CAVALRY IN VIRGINIA. PHILADELPHIA, April 10.-Forney's Press has received reports that General Stoneman has cut the railroad between Danville and Greensboro', and that Gen. Sherman has occupied Raleigh, the capital of North Carolina.

The Goldsboro' correspondent of the Associated Press, under date of the 6th instant, states that rebel deserters and refugees report the Evacuation of Raleigh. and that there is no rebel force of any account between Goldsboro' and Raleigh.
