The Perpetrator of the Murderous Assault on Secretary Seward Identified.

WASHINGTON, April 1.—Late last night a man disguised as a laborer was carrying a pick on his shoulder approached the house occupied by the family of Surratt, in this city, and was seen entering when he was arrested, and soon washed the dirt from his face proved to be quite a different looking person from what his appearance at first indicated.

He called himself Haines and exhibited not a little embarrassment. He managed to ask in an agitated tone why he was arrested.

The colored servant of Secretary Seward was sent for when he immediately exclaimed, "that's the man, I know him by general appearance and his mouth."

The servant said there could be no mistake. Others in Secretary Seward's house at the time who probably have a collection of his garments will be afforded an opportunity to-day to recognize him. He is believed to be Surratt who perpetrated the dreadful deed at Secretary Seward's house on Friday night.
