THE CITY COUNCIL.

Fires, May 30.—Present James Young, Esq., President. Mr. Keyes, a resident of Siam, has written to his friends to stick a well in front of his residence, No. 337 and 339 West Fayette street, to express his thanks for the services of the local fire department.

Mr. Evans submitted a resolution accepting the place of Mr. A. Fredrick for a new City Hall; adopted.

Mr. Evans submitted a resolution in favor of Miss Pepple for taxes paid in error.

Also, a resolution in favor of W. H. Haynor, asking to be paid \$100 for services performed for the city, adopted.

Mr. Evans called up the ordinance appropriating \$100,000 for the completion of Bay View Avenue passed.

Mr. Evans submitted a resolution in favor of Mr. John Schmid, to sick a well; adopted.

The same gentleman called up the resolution in favor of J. W. & A. D. Higginbotham and Lettis, adopted. Also, the resolution to construct a wooden bridge on Doctor's street, and for the construction of a carriage way around the bridge, adopted.

Mr. Evans submitted an ordinance fixing the compensation of street laborers employed by the corporation; laid over.

A committee, consisting of Mr. H. H. Anderson, relative to the rate of freight on carloads between Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, was received from the Illinois Central Railroad Company.

The same was received from the Second Branch of the Boston and Worcester Railroad Company.

Mr. Evans submitted an ordinance granting James Hodges a permit to erect a bay window in his residence on Howard street; adopted.

Sacred Heart—Preston, Daniel Harvey, Esq., President.

Plated Bill, No. 57, authorizing the City Passenger Railway Company to extend their line from Franklin to Second Street, passed.

Mr. Birch called up resolution authorizing him to take up the iron in the mouth of Jones Falls, and to lay it across the carriage way; adopted.

The bill appropriating the sum of \$10,000 for the education and improvement of colored children in Baltimore city was called up by Mr. Moore.

Mr. Ireland moved that \$10,000 be substituted, which was laid on the following day.

Voted—Mr. Ireland—1.

Nay—Moses, Harvey, Birch, McElroy, Rutledge, Burke, and Moore—4.

Mr. Moore moved that the passage of the bill, as passed by the following vote:

Yeas—Moore, President, Birch, McElroy, Rutledge, Burke, and Moore—4.

Nay—Harvey, and Ireland—2.

Resolved, in favor of the policies of Rev. John M. Judson for the benefit of a destitute, was called up by Mr. Ireland, and voted for by the members of the church.

Mr. Ireland presented by Mr. Keane against grants permission to Moses J. J. H. and W. H. Higginbotham to erect a building on the corner of Howard and Franklin streets; adopted.

Mr. Birch called up the resolution pro-

viding for the erection of gas lamps around the University buildings; and the bill was called up by Mr. Moore.

Mr. Moore moved that the resolution favoring the petition of James H. Simpson to erect chemical works in South Baltimore; passed.

Mr. Moore called up the bill authorizing the State of the Grand Junction Park Railway to charge 5 cents fare for adults and 3 cents for children, and was laid over.

Mr. Birch moved to amend by allowing the fare of 5 cents for children, which prevailed and the bill passed.

The President appointed Moses, Birch, and Moore to a committee on the dis-

patch of the dispatches relative to the inci-

ence of a track of the tiny passenger rail-

way. The whole matter was afterward re-

ferred to the Committee.

The Chair presented from the First Branch the application bill for 1000 shares of stock in which were included the names of a number of citizens being slightly amended. Adopted.
