THE EXECRATION PRODUCED BY PRINCE NAPOLEON'S SPEECH.

The speech of Prince Napoleon makes a prodigious stir in France. The Paris correspondent of the London Times writing May 26, says:

The Empress has sent her orders to the Paris press to say as little as possible, if not nothing at all—on this famous speech. The speech has raised a question of surprise in M. Guizot's journal, *Opinions Nationale*, for its laudatory article on the speech, will be met in the Senate. The thirty-second article of the decree of the 21st of February, 1862, specifies that the speech of the Emperor, either after a judicial or administrative suspension, or as a measure of general security, but only by special decree of the President of the Republic.

M. Opereau, Minister of War, has already made an execrable speech, with protestations of loyalty and devotedness to the Government; it is not probable that this high handed measure will be carried out.

The Marquis de Boissay uttered the other day strong sentiments in favor of the speech. According to his word, he took advantage of a correction in the minutes of the previous sitting about the employment of foreigners, to speak particularly in the public administration, to the exclusion of the army.

"I am willing that France should show the largest hospitality to all foreigners. I do not except even them when I have sometimes attacked for taking part in revolution, the cause of the Poles, who will now applaud the decision of the Emperor, as a glorious, revolutionary speech which has so moved us all, and on which I hope the Government will vouchsafe to give us some explanations."
