DEATH OF BISHOP POTTER. From California we have the melancholy intelligence that the Right Rev. Potter, Protestant Episcopal Bishop of Pennyslvania, died in the city of San Francisco on the 4th of July .-Bishop Potter had been in ill bealth for some time, which was caused by the severity of his Episcopal labors. In order partially to relieve him, an Assistant Bishop was elected. The first choice fell upon the Rev. Sampel H. Bowman, and uter the death of the latter the Rev. Wm. Becon Stevens was elected to fill the vaexney. Bishop Potter, during the war, was very active, and gave a large portion of his time to the support of enterprises which were engaged in the Christian work of assisting the soldiers in the field, and the sick and wounded. This was a [labor of love to him, and added to his Episcopal duties, the burden was too heavy. It was the wish of his people that he should seek rest, and matters were so arranged some months ago that it was possible for him to withdraw for a period, and endeavor to recuperate his

Betore his departure he was married to a lady of New York, who accompanied him upon the voyage. At the last accounts received from him at l'anama, his health had much improved, and his friends looked forward to his happy return in due time, with renewed vigor. But it was not the will of Providence that he should ever again meet the people who were under his Episcopal charge, and while the latter will be grieved and startled by the sudden announcement of his death, it is their duty to apply those centiments of resignation which the decessed has so

Atter the death of Bishop White, the Rev. Alongo Potter was called upon to discharge the daties of the Bishop of Pennsylvania, and he was consecrated on the 231 of September, 1545. Bishop Potter has written several books f established reputation.
