THE REVOLUTION THOROUGH-PEACE PERMANENT.

Fears are sometimes expressed by those who as it seems to us have not rightly considered the nature of the late conflict, that the peace we at last enjoy will not be permanent; that under the mortifications of defeat, and the restrictions necessarily put upon the action of those who have hitherto had almost unlimited sway in dealing with a dependent race, the beaten side may again resort to insurrection and bloodshed, to attempt a doubtful "independence." We have no fear of any such visitation, again. Up to the period when this conflict was "precipitated," let it be noted that no power ever dared a government with more arrogant expectations of having matters all their own way. The whole struggle, the assault was based upon misrepresentations of relative strength and resources, as well as upon the world's estimate of the nature of their cause; and the fact should be plain to the least hopeful of a good future, that the South—whatever else it may do—is not going to repeat its mistakes.

It has made an experiment which it had in contemplation for the full third of a century; and it has expended upon that experiment every resource it could by the direst effort of sacrifice, command. And whilst it will be seen stirring anew and speedily for political power, whilst the ambitions will be only partially repressed, and the disappointed be temporarily commended to inaction, the signs of the times indicate that even at the next session of Congress, there will be enough of these made eligible to make the defeated consider themselves as again fully identified with the Government they would have destroyed; and more and more will they see thus that the interests of the lately divided sections are identical, and must be thenceforward considered as indeed a unit.

And then we have but to note the daily progress of events, the rapid changes taking place, to confirm the view of the case we have given. As things are moving, the South will hardly know itself in five years. Taking Newbern, for instance, one of the least active or promising towns in that whole section, before the war, we see it stated that an addition of ten thousand active and enterprising workers has been made to its population, already revolutionizing its trade, and developing resources it hardly dreamed in the past of seeing made available. And as of Newbern, so of countless other places most readily accessible to the thronging populations which overflow from a thousand localities North, to find appropriate fields for enterprise and labor in these developed spots, so long almost given over to decay and neglect.

These agencies, we repeat, these developments of interest, are the great conservators of peace. Whilst in the past every effort was made by the leading spirits of the South to isolate that section, to cut it off from all influences calculated to change the views, social or political, of its people, its very helplessness, at present, compels it to reach out for aid, whilst the greatest cause which blighted its prospects, being no longer in existence, no longer clinging to, as a delusion and a snare, makes almost any new suggestion welcome which will help to rescue it from its final condition.

These agencies, we repeat, these developments of interest, are the great conservators of peace. Whilst in the past every effort was made by the leading spirits of the South to isolate that section, to cut it off from all influences calculated to change the views, social or political, of its people, its very helplessness, at present, compels it to reach out for aid, whilst the greatest cause which blighted its prospects, being no longer in existence, no longer clinging to, as a delusion and a snare, makes almost any new suggestion welcome which will help to rescue it from its final condition.

The one great fact that the line which created sectionalism has been entirely rubbed out; the confessions we daily hear from the most prominent politicians South, that "slavery is gone," just as much recognizes all great causes of irritation with both Ollis and Kentucky for instance, as with New York and Pennsylvania. No raids into the free states to recover fugitive slaves, and no vigilance committees to subdue "Abolitionists," who might chance to venture across the line, for the first time in the history of the nation, Union is to mean, in the future at least, fraternality, a common interest, a common patriotism. That there will be for a time bitter memories and angry feuds within individuals, leading to crime and bloodshed, all must expect. But then the Government will be found abundantly able and determined to put down all disturbances. A single glance at the long list of able officers retained in the service as conservators of the peace, should reassure even the most timid and distrustful; in the police we have indicated. It demonstrates clearly that the Government thoroughly comprehends the situation; that although it recognises that peace has returned, that it intends to hold a firm sway over all contingencies until the time when circumstances could not have been effected in centuries.

MARYLAND BREVETS.

It is a pleasant fact to record, that quite a large number of brevets have been given by the President of the United States to Maryland officers, who have distinguished themselves on different occasions by meritorious conduct. These brevets will be published as soon as the pressure of business in the War Department permits. Among those who have been already notified of their promotion by brevet are Col. R. N. Howserman, of the 4th Regiment Maryland Volunteer Infantry, who has been breveted as Brigadier General of Volunteers. He had served nearly four years, starting in 1861 as Captain, and his twice wounded, his brevet being bestowed for distinguished gallantry in the battle of Five Forks, April 1st, 1865. The brevet of Major F. W. Simon, 12th Maryland Volunteers, was bestowed also for gallant conduct on the same occasion, making him a candidate for the First Branch City Council.
