A PALISSY POTTERY UNKARTIERD A Paris correspondent of the New York Warld, writing on the 4th instant, says: A few days since a very interesting dis covery was made in the Place du Caronsed. A wing of the old Palace of the Louvre has lately been torn down for the purpose of rebuilding it in harmony with the newer parts of the palace. In making excarations for the new foundations a number of moulds for pottery and an ancient furnace were laid bare by the workmen. The superintendent sent at once for the architect, who, in his turn, ad dressed himself to a distinguished savant M. Bertz, for information with regard to listreasure trove. M. Bertz bas devoted many years to the study of archælegical remains of Paris, and recognized in the furnace and earthenware fragments the ork of the celebrated Bernard de Palissy to whem the revival of the enameling of pettery in France is due.
