

Art's Ideas On Lynching Find Exhibition Place

50 Paintings And Sculptures Showing Mob Treatment Of Negroes Are Arranged In N. Y. Gallery

New York, Feb. 15 (AP)—After being cancelled by one art gallery because of protests, an exhibition called "An Art Commentary On Lynching" opened at another gallery today with a reception to 400 invited guests.

Negroes being tortured or lynched by mobs are shown in virtually all the fifty paintings and sculptures, some of which are by well-known artists.

Patrons of the exhibition, arranged by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, include Gov. Herbert H. Lehman, Senator Robert F. Wagner, Ina Claire and Jane Cowl, actresses; Zona Gale and Pearl Buck, authors, and Arthur Bodanzky, musician.
