The tenant house dates from at least 1903 since it appears on a Coast and Geodetic Survey Topographic Map of that year. (It does not appear on the 1846 C & G Map.)

In 1906 the widow Mary Morris Murray, owner of the 204-acre Tulip Hill farm, sold the manor house and 54 acres while retaining 150 acres of farmland located to both sides of the manor house parcel. It appears that she kept possession of the tenant house, close though it was to the manor house. A look at the accompanying 1906 plat shows how she manipulated the northern boundary line of the conveyed parcel so that it excluded the tenant house from the conveyance. No doubt she had a tenant farmer living there who was needed to work her retained farmland. She had not been residing at Tulip Hill herself, rather at neighboring Ivy Neck Farm which she inherited from her parents, Caspar and Ann Cheston Morris.

In 1935 Mary Murray's widowed daughter-in-law, Olivia Murray, sold a small parcel including the Tulip Hill tenant house and a strip of land for an access road to Mary Flather, owner of the Tulip Hill manor house (FAM 140/197 and JHH 211/994). Willie and Martha Brown were living in the tenant house at that time. They had been living there since the 1920's, Willie working as Mrs. Flather's chauffeur.

After Willie Brown's death c.1940, Gus and Cornelia Tongue moved into the tenant house. Gus worked parttime at the Woodfield Oyster Co. in Galesville and parttime around the grounds of the manor house. He stayed at Tulip Hill through four owners: Mrs. Flather c.1940, Douglas Conoley until 1946, Susan and Anne Kondrup 1946-48, and the Lewis Andrews, 1948 to present.

After Gus Tongue's death in 1984, Stanley Turner moved into Tulip Hill Tenant House and is the current occupant.

The Tenant House has old brick foundation walls. The interior had not been surveyed.




