The Francis Shipley House is a two story frame building with a brick foundation and basement and a double cross gable roof with brick corbeled chimneys, just north of either crossing. Consisting of three major blocks and several projections, the house is a good example of late nineteenth century domestic vernacular architecture which borrows most of its formal characteristics from the Federal style tradition. This influence is particularly noticeable in the regular fnenstration and the suggestion of bilateral symmetry in the placement of elements on the south facade of the main block. The irregular massing, polygonal projections, attenuated columns, and shingled gable end recall the Queen Anne style.

Pursuant to our telephone conversation this afternoon, I enclose a series of easements for review by you and your Legal Department. These include: 1) a blank sample easement sent with our blue easement guidebook; 2) an exterior easement on a building in Charles County; and 3) a deed which incorporates standard easement language for a building, calling for restoration of both exterior and interior items.

On April 28, 1982, I had an opportunity to visit the Francis Shipley House (HO-568) in Savage, Howard County, Maryland, and inspected the building to ascertain its condition, in order to give an opinion as to whether the building was eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.

Unfortunately, as you and Matt Bogden reported, the building has been badly vandalized since the time the building was surveyed by MHT/M/DOT surveyor Richard Meyer in 1980. Because the building is now completely open, much of the interior fabric (including door and window surrounds, newel posts, balusters, handrails, step ends, doors, etc.) have been stripped from the building. Many windows and doors, as well as wall finishes and trims, have also been badly damaged.

Although the building is still in relatively good structural condition (with roof intact), the ultimate question of the worth of the building must be addressed, as must such variables as the cost to secure the building, move it to another location, and selling it. Because the building's architectural integrity has been so badly compromised, it is our opinion that the building is now not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Furthermore, because of the building's lessened value in relation to other M/DOT properties, it is our opinion that M/DOT should take, at minimum, the following steps before demolition of the property is mutually agreed upon:

 Continue steps to sell building to a private owner, with stipulation that he absorb cost of moving the structure. Mr. Frederick Gottemoeller April 29, 1982 Page 2

> 2) Document the building photographically, using both black and white print and color slide film. M/DOT photographer should take photographs of all facades and views of interior rooms, details, etc. 5"x7" glossy prints, negatives, and slides should then be transmitted to MHT for our photographic archives.

If M/DOT fails in its efforts to sell the building, the Trust, I am sure, will view this as a last, good faith effort to preserve the structure, and reluctantly approve its demolition.

I think this situation is an excellent case study of why the Trust became involved with the BPW Preservation Policy in the first place. Here, a perfectly usable building with local historical significance and good architectural detail was allowed to deteriorate to its present ruinous condition. M/DOT has clearly done an inadequate job to secure the building, and should have taken concrete actions to board up the building immediately after it was vacated. We can only hope that M/DOT will take efforts to secure other historic buildings under its control that the Trust has previously noted in its draft report as significant. Only in this way can we be assured that historic structures in your ownership will survive at least the lengthy period during which our report concerning their future maintenance and disposition is being approved.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Francis Shipley House is a two story frame building with a brick foundation and basement and a double cross gable roof with brick corbeled chimneys, just north of either crossing. The house consists of three major blocks and several projections. At its east end, the principal block, having an E-W ridge line, forms a "T" with a second block having a slightly lower ridge line, while at its NW corner, a third block having an even ridge line meets to form an "L". The principal block is three bays wide and three deep; the second, three wide (extended to five) and one deep; and the third, two wide and two deep. There are two polygonal bays projecting from the west facade, that on the left having a single story and shed roof, that on the right, two stories and a flat roof. A single story addition with a polygonal bay and shed roof adjoins the left side of the east facade, while the three bays on the upper right project slightly over those below. Futhermore, the upper right bay of the principal block projects several feet and assumes the form of a gabled dormer with an imbricated shingle end. The space between the ancillary blocks is built in below the gable line and capped by a shed roof, gently sloping to the west,

There are three porches: one adjoins the principal block on the south and is sheltered by a shed roof supported by three evenly spaced square columns tapered toward the top, yet flared slightly, suggesting a capital. Another is fitted into the NW corner and has two stories with a flat roof. The upper level is screened; the lower, enclosed. A third porch adjoins the east addition on the south and has a flat roof and false entablature, both supported by three evenly spaced square columns with simple corbel-like capitals.

Windows are profuse and, for the most part, regularly disposed. The majority are of the 4/4 or 6/6 double hung sash type and, except for those piercing the polygonal bays, are framed by shutters.

Centered in either end bay of the south facade porch are attenuated double doors. There are two single doors on the north facade, that on the right surmounted by a bracketed hood, and two more adjoining the SE porch, one from the east block, the other from the addition. A brick stairway and rounded parapets are nearly centered on the south facade, while brick steps and a double metal railing face the SE porch. A bulkhead cellar entrance adjoins the two story polygonal bay.

Walls are sheathed in German siding; the roof in shingles.

Ca. 25' north of the house is a brick and frame double bay garage with a moderately sloped gable roof and exposed rafter ends. The south facade is marked by a single door flanked by single windows, alwith oversized concrete lintels.


10. Verbal Boundary Description


