

- Panoramic photograph of Company I, A Rifle Unit in the 808th Pioneer Infantry, an African American unit in World War I.
- Three limited edition screen prints by Tom Miller.
- Portrait of Charles Carroll, Barrister, by Frances Mackubin.
- Early 1800s view of Dartmoor Prison by prisoner J. I. Taylor. Will enhance research into the soldiers and sailors who were imprisoned there during the War of 1812.
- Letter from Baron Johann de Kalb to George Washington describing a dispute between officers in his Maryland regiment.




