NOTES

- 1. This is probably an error. In all previous censuses he's listed as Mulatto. In the city directories he's identified as "colored."
- 2. In the 1910 Census (Baltimore City, Ward 17, District 286, Dwell 161, Fam 224), Agnes V Roberts is listed as a widow, Mulatto, and the sister of Helen V Bishop. So Henry must have died between 1900 and 1910.
- 3. Probably an error since she, her sister (Helen V) and niece (Helen E) are listed as Mulatto in 1910 Census.
- 4. Helen V Bishop is first in the family listing for both the 1900 and 1910 censuses. The 1910 address is 929 Argyle Avenue.
